

ORDINANCE NO. 19-16

**AN ORDINANCE REAUTHORIZING THE RURAL COUNTY
HEALTHCARE FACILITIES TAX AND AMENDING THE DAGGETT
COUNTY CODE TO INCLUDE THE TAX**

WHEREAS, on April 4, 2006, the Board of County Commissioners passed a resolution which provided notice of an election regarding the imposition of a local sales and use tax of 1% to fund Rural County Healthcare Facilities in Daggett County, and other services as provided in Utah Code §59-12-802, and;

WHEREAS, a special sales and use tax election was duly and lawfully called and held on June 27, 2006, at which the proposition for the imposition of the aforementioned sales and use tax of 1% was approved by the majority of the qualified registered electors voting, and;

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners passed Ordinance No. 06-19, which levied the tax, effective January 1, 2007, and;

WHEREAS, the tax has been used to help fund a healthcare clinic located in Manila, Utah, a township located in Daggett County, among other things, and;

WHEREAS, the Manila Clinic has provided, and continues to provide much needed medical care to local residents, and;

WHEREAS, the funds from the tax are needed to continue to provide medical care and emergency services to the residents of Daggett County, as well as for all other purposes provided for under Utah Code §59-12-802, and;

WHEREAS, Pursuant to Utah Code §59-12-802, the Rural County Healthcare Facilities tax must be reauthorized by the legislative body of the County, and;

WHEREAS, the Daggett County Code was adopted by the Board of County Commissioners of Daggett County on December 5th, 2017, and;

WHEREAS, Title 2, Finance and Taxation, Chapter 2, Taxes, of the Daggett County Code contains provisions for the Sales and Use Tax of Daggett County, and;

WHEREAS, there is a need to update the Daggett County Code to reflect this reauthorization of the Rural County Healthcare Facilities Tax, and;

WHEREAS, the Daggett County Board of commissioners finds it is in the best interest of the public health, safety, and welfare of the county to reauthorize the Rural County Healthcare Facilities tax and amend the Daggett County Code accordingly.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED by the Daggett County Board of Commissioners as follows:

Section 1: The Daggett County Commission adopts this ordinance pursuant to Title 1, Chapter 1, Section 3 of the Daggett County Code and other authorities and provisions of Utah Statutory and Common laws as applicable.

Section 2: This ordinance shall take effect immediately following its adoption and signature by the Daggett County Commission. All prior ordinances or code sections inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed or amended as set forth herein.

Section 3: The Rural County Healthcare Facilities Tax in Daggett County is hereby reauthorized pursuant to Utah Code §59-12-802.

Section 4: SECTION I. Title 2 – Finance and Taxation, Chapter 2 – Taxes, is hereby amended to include a new article, titled “Article E. Optional Sales and Use Tax for Transportation,” which Optional Sales and Use Tax for Transportation is hereby imposed and adopted as follows, to wit:

Chapter 2F – RURAL COUNTY HEALTHCARE FACILITIES TAX

2-2F-1: TITLE:

This article shall be known as the *RURAL COUNTY HEALTHCARE FACILITIES TAX*.

2-2F-2: STATUTORY AUTHORITY

The authority for imposing this tax is derived from Utah Code §59-12-103(1) and Utah Code §59-12-801 et. seq.

2-2F-3: IMPOSITION; AMOUNT:

In addition to all other taxes imposed, the County does hereby impose and levy for collection a Sales and Use Tax of 1% on the transactions described in Utah Code §59-12-103(1) within the county, including the cities and towns within the county.

2-2F-4: ALLOCATION:


This *Rural County Healthcare Facilities Tax* shall be allocated in accordance with Utah Code §59-12-802.

2-2F-5: EFFECTIVE DATE:

The effective date for the tax imposed by this article was January 1, 2007.
