GRANTS AVAILABLE FOR SPECIALTY CROP PRODUCTION

For the second year in a row, the Utah Department of Agriculture and Food (UDAF) is encouraging other agencies, universities, institutions, and industry or community based organizations to apply for grants to assist specialty crop production. The grants are available through the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Agricultural Marketing Service, and will be awarded to enhance the competitiveness of specialty crops. Program overview

"This is an opportunity for specialty crop stakeholders to fund projects that will benefit the specialty crop industry as a whole," said Jed Christenson, Director of Marketing for the UDAF. Specialty crop grants were awarded last year for ten projects that varied from researching the use of drought tolerant native flora or controlling weeds in onions, to the use of scent baited traps in orchards to control insects in lieu of pesticides.

The deadline for submitting an <u>application form</u> to receive a portion of the allocated \$103,000 is January 31, 2008. An <u>application packet</u> and full program overview is available on line at <u>www.ag.utah.gov</u> or by calling Jed Christenson at (801) 538-7108.

Specialty crops are defined as fruits and vegetables, tree nuts, and nursery crops (including floriculture). To be eligible for a specialty crop grant from the State, projects must enhance the competitiveness of specialty crops.

Examples of "enhancing competitiveness" of specialty crops includes, but is not limited to: research, promotion, marketing, nutrition, trade enhancement, food safety, food security, plant health programs, education, buy local programs, increased consumption, increased innovation, improved efficiency and reduced costs of distribution systems, environmental concerns and conservations, product development, and developing cooperatives.

Attention Fishermen!

The Loa State Fish Hatchery is under temporary quarantine after DWR biologists confirmed an outbreak of New Zealand mud snails in the water. The biologists aren't sure how the snails got there and are hopeful that they can treat the fish before placing them in rivers and streams this spring. The fish pathologists at the Fisheries Experiment Station in Logan are evaluating treatment options. The New Zealand mud snails are just one of several aquatic nuisance species that have made their way into Utah. Those found in Utah are female and reproduce asexually. Because they are asexual, only one snail is required to establish a new colony. One snail can reproduce hundreds of young per year. New Zealand snails are nasty animals. In other state, they have already ruined fishing and affected boating and recreational activities in waters they have infested.

There are several things you can do to avoid bringing the snails from outside the state, and to avoid transporting them from one body of water in Utah to another. Disinfecting your waders and other fishing gear – before you step into a different body of water – is one of the best things you can do. Also, if you are fishing on a river or stream, disinfect your waders and gear before moving to a different stretch of the same river to fish.

Financial Management Training

It's a New Year! Time to think about the future and how you can get to where you want to be! There is a one hour break for lunch. Topics include: Budget Development, Money Management, Wise Use of Credit and Consumer Information. The course is free and open to anyone interested in getting control of their finances. This course is sponsored by Daggett County, Daggett School District, Utah State University Extension, AAA Fair Credit Foundation, plus the Utah Individual Development Account Network and their sponsors. Individual Development Accounts

Those who complete the course and are low to moderate income are eligible to apply for an Individual Development Account. IDAs are special matched savings accounts that help low to moderate income families establish a pattern of regular savings toward the purchase of one of three productive assets: a post-secondary education, a first home, or a small business start-up. IDAs embody the belief that asset accumulation is the key to helping the working poor reach economic self-sufficiency. "Save, Learn, Earn, and Invest" are the foundational tenants of the program. The match incentive - similar to an employer match for 401 (k) contributions - is provided through a variety of government and private sector sources." 

A PUBLIC HEARING AS BEEN CALLED BY THE DAGGETT COUNTY COMMISSION FOR TUESDAY, JANUARY 15, 2008 AT 11:00 A.M. AT THE DAGGETT COUNTY COURTHOUSEFOR PURPOSE OF UPDATING THE DAGGETT COUNTY GENERAL PLAN AND ZONING ORDINANCE AS WELL AS THE DUTCH JOHN GENERAL PLAN AND ZONING ORDINANCE. ITEMS TO BE CONSIDERED INCLUDE:

- Specifying the Runway Protection Zones (RPZ) as areas of no development and building for both the Dutch John and Manila Airports
- Specifying the Approach Zones (EAZ) as areas of no development and building for both the Dutch John and Manila Airports
- Specifying restrictions applicable to the Airport Influence Area (AIA) for both the Dutch John and Manila Airports
- Modifying the zoning around the Dutch John Airport from MU-40 to Light Industrial and/or Commercial
- Removing the Bond Requirement as part of the Building Permit Requirements in Section 109, paragraph 2 (Page 7) of the Dutch John Zoning Ordinance.
- Amend Section 612 (Page 17) of the Daggett County Zoning Ordinance to allow the maximum height of accessory buildings to be 35 feet instead of 20 feet.




