The coaches of the 1A teams throughout the state then have the opportunity to vote for their choice of Seniors to play in the annual UHSBCA (Utah High School Basketball Coaches Association) All Star Game. The coaches are not allowed to vote for players on their own team.

Manila High School MVP, Jared Reed, was voted by the 1A coaches to play in the 2010 All Star game. Jared is the son of Chad and Marilyn Reed. Congratulations to Justin Olsen who was also invited to participate. Justin is the son of James and Derlene Olsen.

Regions 17, 18, and 19 formed the 1A South team with players from Tintic, Meridian, West Ridge, Mount Vernon, Intermountain Christian, Green River, St. Joseph and Liahona coached by St. Joe Coach Mike Greely and his assistant. 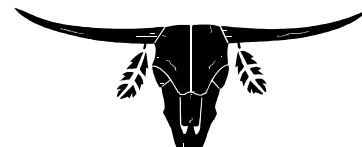

Election Update

Party Caucus meetings were held on March 23rd. A record 136 people attended the Manila Precinct meeting and 41 attended the Dutch John Precinct meeting for the Republican Party Caucus meetings. Twenty one local delegates and three state delegates were elected between the two precincts.

The Democratic Party's meeting was held at the Senior Center on the same evening, but was not as well attended. Those attending nominated Dave Hughes and Mari Campbell as their State Delegates to attend the May 8th State Convention in Salt Lake City. Dave Hughes the Party's County Chair said local Democrats are supporting the state and federal Democratic Party candidates even though there are no local candidates for this election. Efforts are being made to bring some of the Democratic Candidates to this year's Daggett Daze celebration over Labor Day weekend

The local Republican Nominating Convention was held on April 1st, 2010. State and Federal elected officials or representatives visited the county to talk about their candidacy. Lt. Governor Greg Bell was present at the local Convention, as were incumbent Senator Kevin VanTassell and incumbent Representative Mel Brown. On the Federal side of the election incumbent Senator Bennett was represented and challenger Cheryln Eager also sent a representative. Delegates from both precincts voted on the local candidates. There will not be a need for a primary this year as all candidates being supported by the party received 90% or more of the votes. Local Republican candidates are: Assessor: Lesa Asay; Auditor Recorder: Keri Pallelsen; Clerk/Treasurer: Vicky McKee; Commissioner A: Warren Blanchard; Commissioner B: Jerry Steglich; and Sheriff: Jerry Jorgensen.

Any candidates wishing to run as a write-in candidate must register at least 30 days prior to Election Day, which is scheduled for November 2, 2010. Contact the County Clerk's Office at (435) 784-3154 for additional information.

Being a Forest Service volunteer just might be one of the most memorable experiences you'll ever have. Just as the trees continue to grow on the National Forests, so does the list of work to be accomplished and services to be provided. As a volunteer, you can make a big difference on the Flaming Gorge National Recreation Area. The volunteer program is very active, and it is looking for individuals who might enjoy doing service at Red Canyon Visitor Center, the Historic Swett Ranch, assisting on the Green River as well as the Green River Visitor Center for the 2010 summer season.

Flaming Gorge National Recreation Area is located in northeastern Utah and southwestern Wyoming. This U. S. Forest Service area is part of the Ashley National Forest and was established in 1968 to develop the recreational opportunities upon completion of the Flaming Gorge Dam. Both the reservoir and the Green River provide excellent fishing, boating, rafting, hiking, wildlife viewing and sightseeing. The scenery is spectacular. Landscapes range from the deserts to cool forests of ponderosa and lodgepole pine to the beautiful High Uinta Mountains. The Red Canyon Visitor Center area is part of this beauty. If you are looking for history to share with others, the Swett Ranch Historic site can't be beat. It is now celebrating its 101 year of existence since its initial filing with the Homestead Act in 1909. And, the Green River itself can bring thrills and chills with excitement of either catching that "big" one or floating the gentle waters on a warm summer day. Green River Visitor Center can give you much information on Wyoming.

Volunteers can make a big difference with a visitors experience at Flaming Gorge. We are looking for those right individuals who can share their time, knowledge and interest with others who wish to gain a rich experience of this particular area. Housing/ RV sites are available with a schedule of four days of work for three days off.

Chapter members won ten state proficiency awards. In Star State Greenhand competitions, Jared Briggs was named the Star State Greenhand in Production. Bennett Gale was the Second Runner-up in Business and Jenessa Gosar was Second Runner-up in Agri-Science. Star recipients received a plaque and cash award.

Breeana Asay, Jake Martin and Chantz Potter were also recognized as American FFA Degree candidates.

In other contests Alle Muir placed second in the Job Interview career development event. Jaris Baker participated in the Extemporaneous Public Speaking Contest and Emily Catron and Aubree Thomas competed in Creed Speaking. Delegates for the convention were Jordynn Hewitt and Wyatt Potter. Jaris Baker was also a member of the State Officer Nominating Committee.

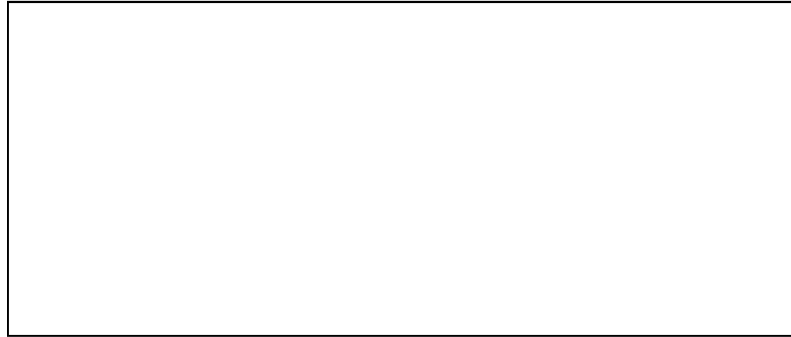
