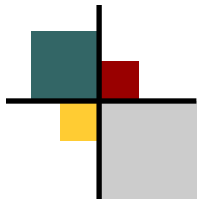

Emergency Management Article Released August 27, 2010 Mitigation Efforts Need Reporting.

Whenever residents in Daggett County have problems with wind, flooding or other acts of nature, it should be reported to the Daggett County Emergency Management Office. Even if the incident is minor, such as a garage getting water from a rain storm or a large branch breaking off of a tree during a wind storm, it needs to be reported. The recording of these incidents all add up and enable the county to obtain grants to help mitigate some of these problems

Mitigation is the effort to reduce loss of life and property by lessening the impact of disasters. This is achieved through risk analysis, which results in information that provides a foundation for mitigation activities that reduce risk, and flood insurance that protects financial investment.

FEMA's Federal Insurance and Mitigation Administration (FIMA) manage the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) and implement a variety of programs authorized by Congress to reduce losses that may result from natural disasters. Effective mitigation efforts can break the cycle of disaster damage, reconstruction, and repeated damage. Daggett County has NFIP flood insurance, which allows residents of Daggett County to purchase this insurance through their insurance companies.

Other mitigation efforts include the trimming of large trees in the area, purchasing barriers or sandbags to help contain ditches or canals or working with Utah Department of Transportation (UDOT) to fix possible slide areas on local highways.

The Emergency Management Office is currently working on a method for residents to report these incidents on the Daggett County website. In the meantime, please report any incidents to Tamara Twitchell, Daggett County Emergency Manager, at 435-784-3210 ext 201 or at ttwitchell@daggettcounty.org



Tower Rock Run

The 2010 Tower Rock Run is in the history books. Daggett County Residents EARLY VOTING

To participate in early voting you must be a Registered Voter by October 4, 2010 and you must bring a picture ID (valid drivers license) when you register and when you cast your vote. Voter Registration forms are available at both Manila and Dutch John post offices and also at the County Clerk's Office. Early voting will take place at the Daggett County Courthouse, 95 N 100 W, Manila, Utah beginning Tuesday, October 19, 2010 through Friday, October 22, 2010 and Monday, October 25, 2010 through Friday, October 29, 2010. The times for early voting will be 9:00 AM – 12:00 PM and 1:00 PM – 5:00 PM. The County Clerk's office will be open until 7:00 PM, **only on Thursday**, October 28, 2010. Early voting will also take place at the Dutch John Conference Hall, 530 S. Blvd., Dutch John, Utah on Wednesday, October 27, 2010 from 2:00 PM to 6:00 PM.

Remember, the last day to register to vote **by mail** is October 4, 2010 but you can still register to vote **in person** at the County Clerk's Office until October 18, 210 until 5:00 PM.

Justice Court News

Effective September 1, 2010, all small claims should be filed in Justice Court. In the past, the amount that could be recovered by filing a small claim in Justice Court was \$7,500. However, this year the Utah Legislature changed the laws pertaining to small claims and increased the amount that can be recovered to \$10,000. This includes interest and court expenses. You should also note that only money can be recovered by filing a small claim. Any attempt to recover property or amounts exceeding \$10,000 will need to be filed in District Court.

In Daggett County we have two precincts (or Justice Courts). How do you know which Court to file in? The rule is simple. The proper Justice Court in which to file, is the court where the defendant resides OR the court in which the cause of action arose. Filing fees may vary depending on the amount of the claim. You can access the courts web site at <http://utcourts.gov/howto/smallclaims/>. You may also contact the clerk of the appropriate court between 9:00am – 11:00 am Monday-Friday for more information.

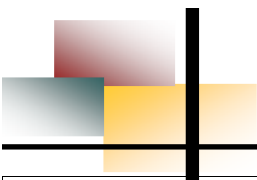

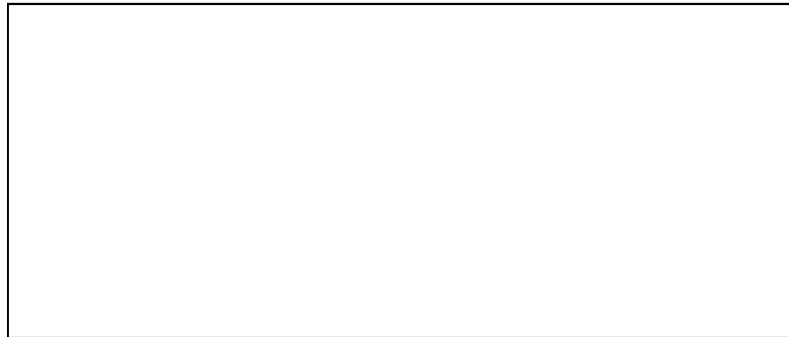
