Northeastern Counseling Center’s substance abuse prevention workers need your help.

It is our goal to pick one winner from each school. A banner will be made with your picture/message and your school name. The banner will then be given to your school to display as they see fit!

Rules for judging need to be acceptable with the *Utah Substance Abuse Prevention Guiding Principles*. Northeastern Counseling Prevention Specialists will be available to assist. Some basic examples are:

- * Message may not detail the effects of alcohol or other drugs. (“Alcohol makes you forget”, “marijuana makes you relaxed”, etc. are not acceptable youth prevention messages)
- * Do not use recovering addicts or alcoholics as role models for youth. (Pictures of people in recovery sending out “look what almost happened to me” messages are not acceptable prevention messages for youth.)
- * Deliver clear messages of “No Use” for youth. (“Drink responsibly or “Drink moderately” are not acceptable prevention messages for youth.)
- * Must attend a school in Daggett County

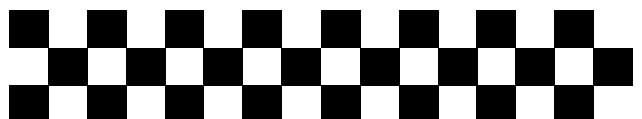

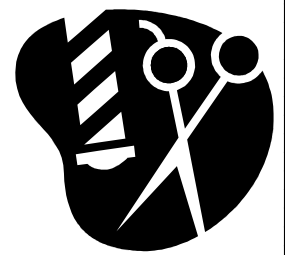
UINTAH BASIN RECYCLING SUMMIT

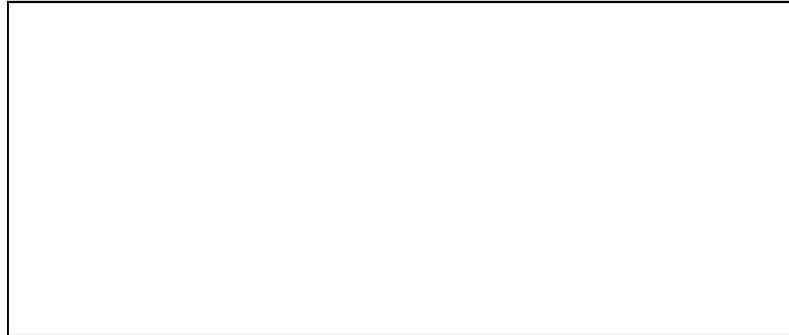

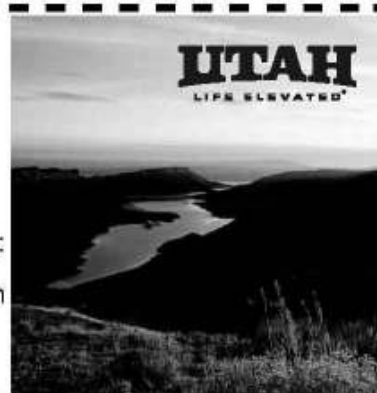
