Mosquito Manager Trainee

Qualifications & Requirements:

- ✦ At least 18 years of age.
- ✦ Current Driver License with good driving record.
- ✦ Must be able to pass a criminal background check.
- ✦ Ability to walk long distances and navigate rough terrain
- ✦ Ability to follow directions
- ✦ Ability to work independently
- ✦ Ability to lift 50 lbs.

Duties will include (but not limited to):

- ✦ Pass tests to become a certified Pesticide Applicator for mosquitoes
- ✦ Drive ATV or truck to locations needing pest treatments or to collect mosquito samples
- ✦ Deploy and retrieve mosquito traps.
- ✦ Document results of trapping activities and send samples to State of Utah.
- ✦ Follow up on resident complaints and inspect their areas for larvae and mosquitoes
- ✦ Apply larvicide or adulticide as needed to prevent build up of adult mosquitoes
- ✦ Document all activities and complete all assigned paperwork
- ✦ Attend UMAA meetings as possible and become educated on best practices for mosquito abatement
- ✦ Attend Mosquito Abatement District Board meetings and report on activities and needs.

The Motorized Vehicle Use Maps

(MVUMs) for the Flaming Gorge Ranger District are now available at Forest Service offices. The MVUMs portray all of the routes available for motorized transportation in Utah and Wyoming and areas available for motorized dispersed camping. The Forest is working to place signs on routes open to motorized travel. Routes will not be signed closed. If the route is not on the Motorized Vehicle Use Map, it is closed to motorized vehicles.

Motorized dispersed camping is limited to within 150 feet (50 yards) of designated routes within Utah and within 300 feet (100 yards) of designated routes within Wyoming. Vehicles may park within one vehicle length of the designated route if not motorize dispersed camp-

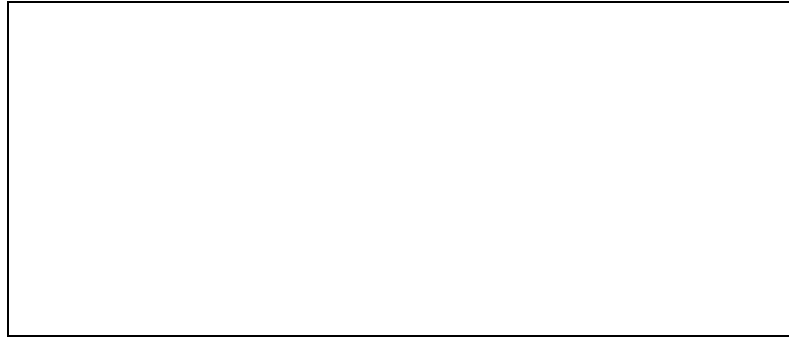
