DONALD LARSEN - Obituary

Donald Larsen, 95, died Tuesday, Nov. 7, 2006, at his home in Washam.

He was born March 15, 1911, in Lyman, the son of Joseph Edward Larsen and Mary Ellen McDonald.

He attended schools in Lyman and graduated from Lyman High School with the class of 1929.

After graduation, he was employed at the CCC camps at Sheep Creek in Daggett County, Utah.

He married Esther Boren on April 2, 1938, in Manila, Utah. Bishop Cliff A. Christensen oversaw the ceremony. Their marriage was later solemnized in the Salt Lake LDS Temple on Jan. 21, 1948.

They moved to Urie, where he ranched for Ross Reed and later worked in the coal mines in Winton during World War II. In 1945, they moved to Manila, where he worked for Marion Campbell.

He purchased a small farm in the Washam District

in Sweetwater County. There he built a home for his family on the Henrys Fork.

He was a member of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. He served as bishop of the Manila LDS Ward for 13 years. He worked as a custodian for the Manila Ward and Daggett School District.

Survivors include his wife, Esther; two sons, Coyne and Keith; six daughters, Duella, Mera Don, Margie, Renae, Ruth Ann and Blenda; 18 grandchildren; and 22 great-grandchildren.

He was preceded in death by three sons, Darwin, Craig and Kerwin; five brothers; and one sister.

Funeral services were held and conducted at noon Saturday, November 11, 2006, at the Manila LDS Ward Chapel.

Utah's OHV Operator Requirements

Do you have children between the ages of eight and 16? Do they ride OHVs (off-highway vehicles)? If so do you know the requirements? OHV users eight to 16 must have a Utah safety certificate, users 16 and older must have either a safety certificate or a current driver's license, to operate on public lands. Utah's Personal Watercraft Operator Requirements

Do you have children between the ages of 12 and 18? Do they ride PWCs (personal watercraft, i.e. jet skies)? If so do they know there are operator requirements? Operators between the ages of 12 and 18 must possess a Utah PWC Education certificate in order to operate a PWC. UDOT Wants Motorists to Heed Winter Weather Preparedness Week

In response to Governor Huntsman’s declaration on Winter Weather Preparedness Week, the Utah Department of Transportation advises motorists to remember to adjust driving behaviors during winter weather.

“When the first snowstorms hit the valley, we typically see a high number of crashes, because people just aren’t used to adjusting their driving behaviors for winter conditions,” said Robert Hull, director of traffic and safety for UDOT. “Snow, sleet and ice on the road require drivers to be more diligent, attentive and cautious. Winter weather conditions can turn small mistakes into serious problems.”

The safety and mobility of motorists during the winter months is a primary concern at UDOT. However, UDOT snowplow drivers frequently talk about the risky driving behavior they see while they’re out plowing Utah’s roadways.

The following tips will help motorists stay safe on the roads this winter:

- Never attempt to pass a snowplow. Let them go ahead of you while they clear the road for you and other motorists
- Don’t get between snowplows when they’re plowing in tandem
- Stay at least 200 feet behind a snowplow
- Slow down and be courteous
- Remove snow and ice from all of your windows before you get on the road
- Increase your following distance behind other vehicles
- Minimize lane changes
- Check commuterlink.utah.gov to see road conditions via real-time traffic cameras
- Call 511 to hear about road conditions on your route

DID YOU KNOW?

- UDOT has pop-up sprinklers along Knudsen’s Corner, which is prone to icy conditions. These devices have built-in sensors that spray the road with an ice inhibitor when the roadway gets to a certain condition. This treatment makes the road safer by preventing ice from forming.
- UDOT actively monitors minute-to-minute weather conditions via weather stations along highways across the state. These weather stations measure valuable information such as pavement temperature, precipitation (differentiating between snow and rain), wind speed and air temperature. This information is then relayed to the Traffic Operations Center and to snow plow drivers, so the right resources can be directed to the most critical areas.
- UDOT uses state-of-the-art snowplows equipped with video cameras mounted on the side of the truck. A small video monitor inside the cab helps the driver be more aware of approaching vehicles, the plow angle and his surroundings.
- UDOT crews start the snow removal process before the snow even falls. Crews spray salt brine on the roads before a snowstorm hits. If forecasters predict a snowstorm will hit the valley within 24 hours, UDOT crews pre-treat the road with this watery solution. While many people think that spraying a watery solution on the roads will make them icy or slick, the salt brine actually lowers the freezing point of the roads, making the snow less likely to stick to the roads.

Permits are \$10 each and will be available from Flaming Gorge Market in Manila, Forest Service Offices in Green River and Manila, Chamber of Commerce in Rock Springs and Flaming Gorge Lodge and Trout Creek Flies in Dutch John!

BROWNS PARK ROAD

The Browns Park Road is a project that has been ongoing for over 30 years. Some improvements have been made through the years. In the mid 1990's the County improved and paved an eight mile stretch.

It has taken nine years to finish the environmental Impact Statement (EIS) for the remaining seventeen miles. Now that this has been completed the County is proceeding on getting the next phase of the road completed.

The Jesse Ewing Canyon is the steepest and most dangerous section of this road and the County Commission has decided to do this section next. Engineering and testing has started and construction is expected to start on this two and one-half mile phase some time in the fall of 2007. The Browns Park Road is probably the most traveled county road and improvements will help with access to the area from Utah, Wyoming and Colorado.

The Bureau of Reclamation (BOR) has allowed The Western Area Power Association (WAPA) to go back to former practices of Double Peaking the flows and electrical generation from the Flaming Gorge Dam during December and January. The County Commissioners and local business owners have expressed their concerns to both the BOR and WAPA, but the new flow regime is scheduled to begin on Friday, December 1st. Please use caution when wade fishing and be prepared for fluctuating flows.
