THREE RECEIVE SCHOLARSHIPS FROM THE UTAH SHERIFF'S ASSOCIATION

Flaming Gorge Medical Clinic

The Medical Clinic has been closed for over two years. The County Commissioners have been working on ways to get it reopened.

The Commissioners have been talking with a non-profit health care provider that says they are willing to help with the clinic, providing the county can come up with some money for the first few years until it can sustain itself.

The County Commissioners were instrumental in getting

legislation passed last legislative session which allows Daggett County to increase its sales tax to pay for a medical clinic and for emergency medical services.

The County Commissioners believe that a three quarters of one percent sales tax increase would be enough needed money for the clinic and help with costs of emergency medical services.

The County Commissioners would urge all residents to vote

in the Primary Election and to vote for Sales Tax Proposition.

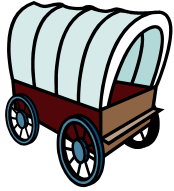
ELECTION NOTICE

Using County Parks and Facilities

On May 2, 2006 in the regular Commission Meeting of the County Commission approved ordinance No. 06-11 which establishes the rules and regulations and policies for use of County Parks and Facilities.

People may still use the park for no charge, but if a person wants to reserve the park pavilion or other county facilities a fee will be charged. These fees will help offset costs of maintenance and utilities.

All non-county users (not county agencies) are required to pay a fee for use of the facilities.

Fees must be paid at least fourteen days prior to the scheduled use. Deposits will be refunded to the user if rules are observed and the area is left in clean condition and there is no damage.

THE ELECTRONIC VOTING MACHINE

How To Use The Voting Machine

1. Upon entering the polling place, the voter signs the official register.
2. The poll worker hands the voter a credit-card size Voter Access Card. It will instruct the voting machine to display the appropriate ballot.
3. The poll worker directs the voter to a voting machine.
4. The voter inserts the Voter Access Card into the slot located on the upper right-hand side of the machine, pushing the card in until it 'clicks'. The Voter Access Card will remain in the machine during the voting process.
5. The machine loads the ballot. The first page contains instructions on how to use the machine. Read the instructions. (Throughout the ballot, an "INSTRUCTIONS" button may be pressed in order to return and review the instructions.)
6. The voter presses the "NEXT" button to move to page 2.
7. Page 2 contains the first page of the ballot. It displays either straight party selections or individual candidate selections. (Straight party voting during the General Election does not lock the voter into choosing straight



- party candidates. The voter is allowed to change selections throughout the entire ballot.)
8. Using finger pressure, the voter touches the selected candidate's name. An "X" appears in the box to the left of that name. To cancel a selection simply touch the name again and the "X" disappears, allowing an alternate candidate selection.
9. The voter touches the "NEXT" button to move through all pages of the ballot. The "BACK" button is used to move backward, allowing corrections.
10. When all selections are complete, the machine will display a summary of the voted ballot. It will also print the voted ballot which may be viewed through a window on the printer attached to the machine. This printout remains inside the machine, locked into a secure canister, This is the paper back-up required by Utah Law.
11. If, after reviewing the voted ballot summary, the voter is dissatisfied with his/her vote, the "REJECT BALLOT" button is touched. The "BACK" button is used to scroll backward through the ballot, making changes. The machine allows the voter to spoil three ballots.
12. If the voter is satisfied with the voted ballot summary he/she presses the "CAST BALLOT" button. The ballot is cast and the machine ejects the Voter Access Card.
13. The voter returns the Voter Access Card to the poll worker. The card is then prepared for the next voter.

Why Electronic Voting?

In 2002, congress passed the Help America Vote Act. Under this act, Utah was required to upgrade the voting system. The State of Utah chose to utilize electronic voting machines. These machines are user friendly, allowing voters to make selections by simply touching the screen with a finger.

Disabled Voter Accessibility

- The voting machines are adjustable, allowing the screen to be displayed at several angles. This allows convenient wheelchair access.
- Each polling place will contain a machine equipped with a keypad and audio headphone system for visually impaired voters.
- The ballot viewing window on the voting machine printer is equipped with a hinged magnifying glass.

Security Features of the Electronic Voting Machine

- The voting machine possesses privacy wings on either side of the touch screen.
- The touch screen is difficult to read if one is not standing directly in front of the voting machine.
- Voting machines will be placed six feet apart.
- The Voter Access Card will allow access to a voting machine only once. It may be re-programmed by a poll worker before it can be used again.
- This eliminates the opportunity to double-vote.
- The voting machine does not allow a voter to select more than the designated candidates or selections for a specific race, eliminating the opportunity to over vote.

Provisional Voting

Provisional voting will be available at every polling place. Voters who are not comfortable utilizing a voting machine may vote provisionally.

Absentee (By-Mail) Voting

Instead of voting at a polling place, any registered voter from any precinct may vote via Absentee Ballot, utilizing the following process.

- Contact the Clerk/Auditor's office (435-784-3154) to request an Absentee Ballot Application. Fill out the application and return it (in person or via mail) to the Clerk's/Auditor's Office.
- The Clerk/Auditor will mail you an Absentee Ballot. Complete the ballot and return it (in person or via mail) to the Clerk/Auditor's office. To be counted, your ballot must be postmarked no later than the date of election day.

Albert Stanton Tinker

Military graveside services for Albert Stanton Tinker, 83, were held Saturday, May 27, 2006, at 2 p.m., at Fort Bridger Cemetery.

A Casper resident, he died at the Sheridan VA Medical Center on May 19, 2006.

He was born May 20, 1922, in Manila, Utah, the son of Fay Waters Tinker and Mary Elizabeth McCool Tinker. He was a veteran of World War II, having served in the U.S. Army recapture of the Philippine Islands. He received a Purple Heart for his service.

He worked on various construction projects in Wyoming and Utah, including Flaming Gorge Dam.

He married Wanda Arthur in 1948 and she preceded him in death in 1965.

He married Betty Hampton and they were later divorced.

He moved to Casper with his family in 1967 and worked for the City of Casper street department until retirement.

He was a member of the VFW, Elks and Eagles and enjoyed hunting and fishing.

Survivors include two sons, Michael Tinker of Aurora, Colo., and Ray Tinker and his wife of Casper; four daughters and their husbands, Marie Miller of Rhame, N.D., Janeen Smith of Littleton, Colo., Paula Burr of Las Vegas, Nev., and Patti Morgan of Cookville, Tenn.; a brother, John Tinker of Manila, Utah; a sister, Isabell Martin of Denver; 10 grandchildren and five great-grandchildren.

He was preceded in death by his parents, his first wife, a sister, Mary Ella Sayeler; a brother, James Waters Tinker; one grandson and one granddaughter.

What is Economic Development?

In my short year of doing economic development I have seen many definitions describing economic development. The one I like best so far says, "Economic Development can be defined as a program, group of programs, or activity that seeks to improve the economic wellbeing and quality of life for a community by creating and/or retaining jobs that facilitate growth and provide a stable tax base."

A recent article in the Salt Lake Tribune (see the entire article on the web at: <http://extras.sltrib.com/counties/detail.asp?CTY=Daggett>) highlighting Daggett county talked about the difficulty of making a living in this beautiful area. The Commissioners and I are interested in seeing businesses prosper and not struggle so hard for survival. There is no single program or activity that is suddenly going to turn things around, especially when you consider that the local economy is reliant on a very narrow base of business types. We are trying many different strategies to bring outside money into the area and make better use of the money already in the area's economy. We've been looking at timber/biomass options, tourism development, business development and infrastructure facility development as ways to expand the economic base of the area.

The State recently held their annual Tourism Conference, where tourism development was identified as economic development and many useful ideas were presented to help all areas of the state build their tourism base and help build local and state tax revenues. Daggett County was the recipient of a \$16,060 marketing grant to promote the Flaming Gorge area to out of State visitors. We will be primarily targeting all the new workers in nearby Wyoming and will also

be working to promote and develop better usage of our local airports for private pilots.

Another training I recently attended highlighted the importance of working with local businesses to assist them in becoming more efficient and therefore better able to cope with the changing business environment. Growth within existing businesses accounts for 70-80% of job creation and some studies indicate that in rural area like ours, the numbers are even higher. The fact that our local employment has grown from 408 in 1998 to 443 in 2003, while several local businesses have closed down seems to indicate some validity to these statistics. My office is open to anyone interested in learning more about financing options, developing business plans, improving their website, researching additional business options or any similar business development activity.

We are trying to combine efforts with the Chamber of Commerce to better promote Community activities and events, plus provide additional training and education to the area to help current and future business owners, managers and employees. 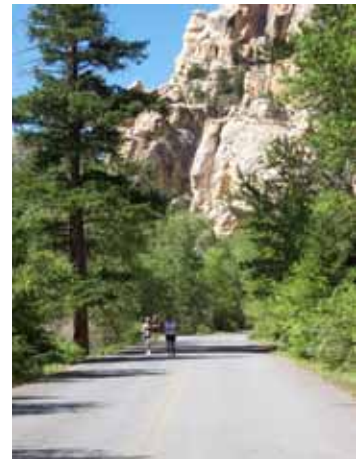

Daggett County Rodeo Grounds

The Daggett County Rodeo Grounds is available for use now that Summer is finally approaching. We are very proud of the facility and encourage people to use it. If you have an event or just want to ride or work your horses and would like to use the County Arena please contact the County Clerk's Office at the Courthouse to check the schedule or secure the facility, make sure it is ready/prepped for your event, and lights turned on if needed.

The county was able to purchase a tractor last year to help maintain the



grounds. Still we are unable to repair all of the holes that come from normal wear with things such as barrel racing or pole bending. With that in mind we ask that you set up in a little different place each time, remove the barrels/poles once you are finished and just kick the holes back in.

The arena will be watered two times a week as the weather warms up. It will be closed on

those days but open again in the evenings. The arena will also be closed for 24 hours the day before a large event in an effort to effectively

prepare the facility/grounds. In addition we will need extra time when preparing for our Junior Rodeo and the Cow Country Rodeo to be held in July. So it will be closed for use for as many as 4 (four) days prior to those events. We will try to post all times it will be closed.

The county is also finding garbage lying around. There are several garbage cans and a large dumpster on the grounds, and would ask that everyone please pick up after yourself and help keep the county facilities looking nice.
